





So many ask where is God when terrorists attack or when a tornado wipes out the majority of a town or city and lives are lost? Why do children die from cancer and why does our beloved mother or father, grandfather or grandmother lose their memory and no longer know who I am?

We want to know what is going on and if God really cares about us or any of this. Why doesn't God redirect a destructive tornado, prevent children from starving and help law enforcement find a murderer before another person becomes their victim and dies.

Our questions get a little more personal when a drunk driver injures or kills a family member or friend. We ask - how can human beings who are created in your image God --- be so careless and even murderous?

Where does the evil come from and how do we overcome it in our lives? Evil is a very real force in our world and in our lives – but God --- God is not surprised by evil. God is not the source of evil – but when disaster happens – God is there.

Many people turn to the Bible and look for the answers to those questions. We won't find all the answers to our questions because God does not give us all the answers. Instead, we need to learn to trust God even in our darkest days of suffering and/or pain. And what is so beautiful about God's everlasting, pursuing love for us is this --- even though we ignore him or turn away from Him – He continues to have supreme power and authority of this world He created --- and He does not turn away from us.

The Bible is the world's number one best-seller of all times and is the most stolen book of all times. Millions of copies in more than two thousand languages and dialects are sold every year. And yet, many do not open and read the Bible on a regular basis. Despite the impression of the Bible's popularity, many find it hard to dig into the pages of scripture and find the answers they are so desperately looking for.

Good and Evil - where did they come from? For the answer to that question, we go all the way back to the beginning – to Creation and the Garden of Eden. When God had completed our universe, He looked around at all He created and said, "it was very good."

Evil entered our world when Adam and Eve disobeyed God and ate from the one and only tree they were told not to from in the middle of the Garden, The Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil. They wanted to be like God, they wanted to know all things and not rely on His goodness or His wisdom and care --- and sin and evil entered our world. We can try and place blame on Adam and Evil – but ask yourself – if I had been tempted by the serpent - would I have obeyed God? **OR** would you have succumbed to the temptation just as Adam and Eve did?

Currently we are walking through the series of **Good and Evil**. We began with "How Did We Get Here" and then moved on to "Dealing with Disasters." We are going to be looking at "Human Disabilities (physical and mental) and the Goodness of God" followed by "Struggling with Disease and Illness," then looking at "Who is Our Enemy in this World," and "The Enemy Within Each of Us," "Overcoming Death's Grip on Our Lives" and wrapping up with "Finding Hope in Our World."

Will we find all the answers we are looking for? Most likely not and these topics may even raise more questions that you have about **Good and Evil.**

My hope is that these questions and others that you have, will lead you into a deeper exploration into your relationship with God and therefore, help you to find and see the unfathomable depth of God's love for you and His infinite goodness.


