What images come to mind when you think about Christmas?

- Is it setting up the tree and hanging all your favorite ornaments accumulated over the years and decorating the house for Christmas?
- Is it taking the kids to see Santa and getting that annual picture taken with them sitting on his lap? Is it gatherings with family and exchanging and opening presents?
- Or perhaps it is singing "Silent Night" in a darkened sanctuary during the candlelight service at the Christmas Eve service.

Whatever images of Christmas we think of first, for many of us, it does not take long for images of winged angels appearing to Mary, Joseph and the shepherds to come to mind.

Angels are not unique to only the Christmas story. They appear in the Bible during significant occurrences in the history of God's people. Their role as God's messengers of hope, peace, salvation, direction, warning and especially of Jesus' identity, make their words in the birth narrative of Jesus – messages we all need to hear, take note of and claim during the season of Advent.

The word "Advent" means coming. During Advent, especially for us Christians, it is a time we prepare and wait expectantly for the coming of our King – the birth of the Christ Child.

This year during the season of Advent, we are going to be taking a look at the angels that are part of the story of Jesus' birth. They are significant to us in our time of waiting and preparing for Advent.

Angels are not just beautiful decorations for our trees.

They are more than the coolest costumes for the Christmas program – everyone wants to be an angel.

It is so easy to reduce them to these roles, even in our formal celebrations!

Think about the Christmas hymns we sing:

Hark! The Herald angels sing, 'Glory to the newborn King'

Angels we have heard on high, sweetly singing o'er the plains

It came Upon the midnight clear, that glorious song of old, from angels bending near to earth to touch their harps of gold

The one role angels have in each of these hymns is – singing – and that is not mentioned in any of the Gospel stories. In the Gospel accounts of Jesus birth – the angels – do not sing. *They speak.* The only Christmas hymn to make this distinction is: *"The first noel the angels did say came to certain poor shepherds in fields where they lay."*

This Advent we are going to focus on the role of angels as messengers of news. The word angel comes from the Greek word *angelos*, meaning messenger. The angels of the Christmas story came to deliver important messages to people who were hoping for God to intervene in a mighty way, both in the fears and darkness of their personal lives and in their world.

I invite you to join us for Sunday morning worship to discover in the Gospels of Matthew and Luke, the stories of the angels' visits as we prepare our hearts for the birth of the Christ Child. Come and hear what God has to say to us – through the messages of the angels of Christmas.

May we come to see and know the connection between what God has done in the past, not only in the lives of his people but also in our lives as well. I pray that you come away with something new this Advent Season that God is calling you to do through the gift of the One who came to bring light and life into the world at Christmas.

Pastoral Report: Pastor Velda

Returned from medical leave on Wednesday, October 5. We celebrated World Communion Sunday, United Women of Faith (UMW) Sunday, and had celebration of Baptism and Confirmation. Also completed another Course of Study/ Seminary class. Hosted Pipestone Ministerial prayer breakfast and attended the monthly Ministerial Business Meeting, along with various other committee meetings.

SPRC: Jenny Severson

District Superintendent Rev. Dr. Fred Vanderwerf met with the SPRC Committee members who were available on November 13 during his visit here at Peace UMC. At this time Pastor Velda will remain at three-quarter time with a discussion held of possibly moving her to full-time in the future. The decision to wait at this time was based on our increased utility expenses, that our Apportionments would also increase and the downturn in congregational giving at this time.

Treasurer's Report: Sandy Lopau

All bills are paid to date.

Appointments are paid to date.

Total Giving for October: \$8,620

Giving for November to Date: \$22,032

At the end of October, our giving/donations are -\$32,000 below our expenses.

We also still have an outstanding balance of \$13,000 left to pay for our new projector when it arrives.

A discussion was held about which copier/printer company we will move forward with. Once our lease is up in April of 2023 we will be moving to Access and a Savon copier. Their bid was the lowest with a guarantee of no increased fees over the 5-year lease period and it also included 2,000 black and white copies and 250 color copies a month in our monthly fee. We also received feedback regarding their excellent service department.

Trustee's Report: Mark Wiese

Chuck went over the treasure's report:

The refrigerator in the kitchen has been repaired. The thermostat was replaced and it was low on Freon.

Church rental agreements needs to be reviewed. Pastor Velda is going to check with other churches regarding their policy and charges.

Pete Sietsema is going to build a bigger aluminum can recycle bin on the south side of the shed.

Found some Emergency Exit lights in the room behind the pulpit. Going to look around the church building to see where we can use them.

The bottom is rotting out of the dumpster. Rick Erks is going to call the city about it and about obtaining a replacement.

Called Tom Hurd and he is not going to do snow removal this year. Bids were obtained for snow removal and Double D came in with the lowest bid. Mark Wiese will contact them about securing their services.

We had another superb turnout for our annual Turkey Dinner selling right around 975 meals. The committee wishes to thank everyone for their time and hard work. Planning the event is easy, but it takes a team to make it happen! We are still waiting for some bills to come in so we don't have an exact amount yet. This year we chose to donate \$75 to the Holiday Caddies being given to the nursing homes and assisted livings in Pipestone, the rest of the 10% for missions going to Relay for Life, and the remainder going to the Trustees for building upkeep of the church and parsonage.

Worship:

There will be a baptism on November 20. Sunday, November 20 following worship, those available are asked to take down Thanksgiving decorations and begin Christmas decorating. Monday, November 21 at 8 a.m. the committee will complete Advent/Christmas decorating. The poinsettias will arrive on December 9 and a schedule was set up for the care of the poinsettias.

Christmas Eve Service at 5 p.m. – will be a candlelight service with communion.




