March – will it come in like a lion and go out like a lamb? Or will it come in like a lamb and go out like a lion? We know that the groundhog, <u>"Punxsutawney Phil,"</u> who has been making predictions since 1886 saw his shadow on February 2. For those who believe in "Punxsutawney Phil," that meant six (6) more weeks of winter, which by "Punxsutawney Phil's" prediction would bring us to the middle of March, if you believe in his legend. I remember "Punxsutawney Phil" when I was growing up, but what I heard more often about March coming and going, was either as a lion or a lamb.

As I think of March this year, I think about the lion and the lamb - and how that relates to Lent, Easter and Jesus. We know that Jewish tradition called for sacrifices, a *"qorban"* was an animal sacrifice, such as a bull, sheep, goat, or a dove that underwent shechita (Jewish ritual slaughter). Sacrifices could also consist of grain, meal, wine, or incense. The Hebrew Bible says that Yahweh (God) commanded the Israelites to offer offerings and sacrifices on various altars. These sacrifices were for atonement of sin. If sacrificing an animal, it had to be spotless, pure, without blemish. If sacrificing grain, meal, wine or Incense it had to be the best of crop and the best from a *"lot"* or batch.

We know that at the Passover meal that the Jewish people slaughtered a "*perfect*" lamb for the meal as part of their Passover celebration for God bringing them out of captivity and slavery from Egypt. To this day, observant Jews prepare for Passover — Pesach — by getting rid of everything in the house that is *chametz* — leavened. They even sell such food, symbolically, until Passover ends.

During his ministry Jesus refers to himself as the Good Shepherd, but also as the Lamb of God – that perfect sacrifice for atonement for our sins. As we walk through this season of Lent with Jesus, as He walks to towards the Cross, He is preparing his Disciples and himself for His death and ultimate sacrifice of the perfect Lamb of God.

As we continue our walk towards the Cross during this season, we will be looking at the difficult teachings of Jesus. Not easy stuff, but holy stuff. A "would be" disciple asks Jesus what he must do to inherit eternal life and Jesus tells him to sell all that he has and give it to the poor. The second week we will look at when Jesus says that those who do not hate their father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters – even their very own life, cannot be his disciple. The third week looking at what Jesus means when He says, "that we should be slaves to others" and not only when being watched, but more so when no one can see what we are doing. We will look at insiders and outsiders, from church membership to citizenship to ethnic identity the fourth week. It is confusing when Jesus tells his Disciples, "to go nowhere among the Gentiles," but then gives the Great Commission to go out into all of the world, preaching and teaching to all. Our final week we will look at the day of final judgment, is it something we should fear or how we can build a faith based on love and joy, rather than fear of punishment. That will bring us to Holy Week and Easter.

We will also be viewing *"The Chosen"* a documentary by Dallas Jenkins on the times and ministry of Jesus, Season One on Wednesday nights at 7 p.m. After watching a segment each week, we will discuss what we saw and heard.

I look forward to worshipping and learning with you during this Season of Lent.
