



Greetings Faithful Disciples of Jesus Christ!

Are you someone who asks questions? Well – I am – I ask a lot of questions. You can "fact check" that with my children.

When I was younger I used to get into trouble at school and church for asking questions. Isn't that what you are supposed to do if you don't understand something?

In the New Testament Gospels, we see people, and especially religious leaders, asking questions. Questions are everywhere throughout the four Gospels. If you sat down and read Matthew, Mark, Luke and John and kept a tally of all the questions asked – there are over three hundred questions that Jesus asked others and around 185 questions that others asked Jesus. What I find interesting is that of the over three hundred questions that people asked Jesus – he only gave direct answers to three of them. If you read Matthew 12:1–4, you will come across Jesus' favorite question. It is the one he asks more than all the others. He asks:

"Haven't you read?"

Jesus will ask this question twice in chapter 12 and then twice again before we finish reading Matthew's Gospel.

Jesus was taught and read the Scriptures. He loves the Word of God. In fact, he is himself the Word of God made flesh.

Of course, in these texts Jesus references the Old Testament. Jesus either directly quotes, references, or makes reference to the Old Testament more than three hundred times in the four Gospels. From Moses to Jonah and from Noah to David, Jesus loves the Word of God. And he wants us to love it too. It's why he keeps asking:

"Haven't you read?"

Note though, it is not Jesus' intent that we become Bible scholars as much as he wants us to become Bible lovers. Jesus wants us to love the Word of God as much as he does.

It's interesting that most of the times when he asks this question he's talking to people he knows have read the Scriptures—quite well but all wrong. In fact, back in Matthew 4 we learned Satan reads Scripture—again quite well but all wrong.

The minute you seek to become a master of the text - is the minute you miss the point of the text. The goal is to be *mastered* by the text - that the text changes you and the way you live your life. And the only way to be mastered by the text - is to read it and then to put it into practice in your life. And that's what Gospel-ling is all about.

"Haven't you read?"

Remember, the goal here is not only increasing your biblical knowledge, but more importantly, that in your reading, that you come to love the Word of God.

Open up your Bible, read the Gospels, and be transformed by The Word.




UWF meets Thursday, October 16, at 10 am







Six dedicated members from Peace United Methodist Church journeyed to Raymond, SD, to serve two days with Solar Oven Partners. Their mission focused on fabricating oven components for solar ovens, a vital resource that promotes sustainable living and energy independence for communities with limited access to traditional cooking methods. Over the course of two days, the participants—Nancy and Jeff Terry, Shelley and Mark Wiese, and Tom and Joan Walker—engaged in various stages of the assembly process and achieved remarkable results:



- Assembled 175 reflector packs
- Deburred and packaged 520 covers
- Hole-punched many Metal J-channel pieces needed for oven assembly
- Filled **15 equipment bags,** including an oven thermometer, a set of measuring cups and spoons, and a WaPi used for water pasteurization
- Packed 49 complete boxes, ready for shipment
- The group also brought along **31 Potholders** and **40 Large Utensil Pouches** that were sewn at home before the mission trip.

Together, these six passionate mission volunteers collaborated with Solar Oven Partners site coordinators, Gene and Wanda Bethke, who are dedicated local farmers from Raymond, SD,
