Mission Report:

The Mission Committee is in the middle of its first project for 2025. We are working on Sally W's house at 603 3rd St, Pipestone. We have had a wonderful volunteer response for this project.

On Tuesday and Thursday evenings for the first two weeks of May, a small group of volunteers began to do repairs at Sally's house. A layer of siding was stripped from the garage. Some of those pieces were good enough to use for repairs on the house, and some new siding was purchased as well. Wooden 1x4 boards were purchased and used on the corners to secure curling siding that the existing tin corner could no longer hold. The shutters were removed, scraped, sanded, and then primed.

On Saturday, May 17, 2025, we started the morning in the Fireside room with prayer and a short devotion. With the rainy weather, a painting station was set up in the church basement where a group of ladies worked in the morning painting the shutters black. A large number of volunteers also spent a cold and windy Saturday doing more siding and corner repairs. Also, a group of men stripped the old shingles off the garage and started to put new tin up. We will wait for a spell of dry weather before we go back to finish the painting on the house.

We are thrilled at the response of the members of our parish to reach out into the community with love for our neighbors.

Once Sally's house is finished, we hope that our next project will be helping Solar Oven Partners construct Solar Ovens that are shipped to Africa, the Dominican Republic, and the Navajo Nation in AZ.
